Life in the Spirit Seminar I : Sr. Betty Igo, M Ed, MSPC, SFP

The Life in the Spirit Seminar is a sharing of the enrichment that Christ offers us through His Holy Spirit. It is an introduction and renewal as a formation experience and an introduction to a life lived more fully in the power and presence of the Holy Spirit...

“Identifying Spiritual Stress - a hidden internal factor contributing to illness and dysfunctional social behavior”:

Kenneth Fung, MD, MB, B.Ch, BAO, FRCS

This workshop will demonstrate how Internal Spiritual Stress is identified, its impact on health (physical, emotional, mental, psychological and social) and the role of Christian Spiritual Healing in Christian Holistic Healthcare in a clinical environment...

“Sexual Addiction: Etiology, Treatment and Recovery”: Benjamin Keyes, PhD, EdD, Merrill Reese, PhD, Charles Zeiders, PsyD

Sexual addiction has been one of the most misunderstood and poorly treated syndromes in Psychology and Counseling for decades. We will focus on causality, etiology of syndrome, diagnosis and treatment issues. Case vignettes will combine with lecture material prompting discussion with attendees. Particular focus will be on spiritual/psychological approaches as part of treatment...

“Helping People Change; Motivating, Engaging and Attracting Clients into Treatment.” David Mee-Lee, MD

Denial and resistance are expected parts of many individuals' presentation. People are often not ready to embrace strategies to improve their mental health and substance use problems. This workshop is designed to increase skills in engaging adults and adolescents with co-occurring disorders, physical health and/or behavioral problems as active participants in developing a treatment contract that makes sense to the client. [A Role-Play of client and clinician interaction will take place.]...

“Group Meditation for Healing”: Guylan Gail Paul, DMin

A research paper will be presented that explored, and evaluated, the results of a six week program using Biblically based guided meditations in a men's prayer group in a high security prison to facilitate spiritual growth (i.e. a growing love of and relationship with God, self, and others), and healing of social and psychological issues...

“Healing Addiction through the Hearts of Jesus and Mary”:

The root of addictions is unaddressed primal pain according to the work of Chris Prentiss and Dr. Arthur Janov. Jesus carried our primal pain in his cry of abandonment on the cross, and Mary's Spirit empowered “Yes” to sharing that pain, models for the Church how joy and community are thereby released. This workshop develops implications from those truths for ministry to addictions...

Through Scripture, and ‘tips’ from Ignatius of Loyola's Rules for Discernment, plus discussion, we will discover simple steps to apply in our daily life...

“Healing Our Religious Addictions through Ecumenical Intimacy; From Idolatry to Relationship”: Jackie Sitte, RN, CARN, LADC I

This workshop addresses the Trauma of the Broken Church and how religious addictions separate us from the full body of Christ. Through sharing information & personal stories, the team will illustrate ways to individual spiritual growth and for each of us to contribute toward Christian unity...

“The Journey from Christian Therapist to Master Christian Therapist”: Len Sperry, MD, PhD, DMin

This workshop focuses on the stages of professional and spiritual development of the Christian healthcare practitioner's journey toward increasing professional expertise/mastery, and integration with spiritual development and maturity...

“How Love Addiction Correlates to the Pain of Abortion”:

Julie Woodley, M.S., Restoring the Heart Ministry

This workshop will help participants understand love addiction and how it relates to abortion. The presenter will use her own story, the stories of other women and therapeutic insights on dealing with love addiction and post-abortive grief and loss. The presenter will share how to help others heal as she shares the depth of God's love for the broken-hearted...

“Madness & Addiction in the Culture of Narcissism: A Jungian Critique of the Addicted American Mind.” Charles Zeiders, PsyD

This workshop critiques the Culture of Narcissism against the Kingdom of God, especially relying on the Jungian concept of the Shadow to illuminate what is not illuminated in our postmodern Soul. The Narcissistic defensive position of our institutions and persons can be understood as creating imbalance and evil in order to preserve Persona – the incomplete, flattering, inflated view of the Self...

†Allen Berger, PhD

Dr. Berger is a nationally recognized expert in the science of recovery and relationship therapy. He is best known for his work on integrating modern psychotherapy with the 12-Steps of Alcoholics Anonymous and emotional sobriety. His own life changed drastically at age 11 when his father died from cancer. Devastated by his death, he internalized his grief and acted out or acted up. He became a very angry young man and eventually dropped out of high school and joined the Marine Corps when he was 17. He personally experienced substance abuse until he was led to what eventually became the first meeting of Narcotics Anonymous on the island of Oahu. During recovery he discovered a passion to help others, and he eventually returned to school and became a psychologist. Subsequently he worked with many of the originators of the programs to treat the entire alcoholic family, treating couples and families who were in treatment of the alcoholic family. He is the author of several books, including “12 Stupid things that Mess Up Recovery”



†David Mee-Lee, MD

Dr. Mee-Lee is a leading expert in co-occurring substance use and mental disorders, with over thirty years experience in program development. He writes and speaks in down to earth, jargon-free language, making learning challenging and enjoyable. Audiences consistently express satisfaction with his combination of rich content and practical approach delivered in his engaging style. His down-to-earth upbringing in Australia coupled with his Chinese heritage makes for an interesting mix of dry humor and quiet wisdom.

Father Rohr is the founder of the Center for Action and Contemplation. He divides his time between Albuquerque and preaching and teaching on all continents.
