It explains how healing is a work of evangelization; how to discern a call and readiness for healing ministry; the spirituality, character and attitude needed for ministry; and how to pray for healing at a group event or with individuals. Also discusses what the Catechism teaches about how suffering, the sacrament of the sick, and praying for healing fit together. 312 pages.
