Fr. William J. Halbing, BA, MA, MDiv

Ordained a priest in Newark NJ. in 1982 and has been the current pastor of St. Antonius parish in NJ since 1999. He has been in the Charismatic Renewal since 1975 and is a much sought after bible teacher in the U.S. He has travelled to Canada, Guyana, Eastern Europe and the Philippines. A speaker at charismatic conferences, the Franciscan University of Steubenville, Tent Revival meetings, Parish Missions and Children's Bible conferences. He has been involved in door-to-door Evangelization and Hispanic ministry. Father is also involved with the Office for Evangelization and serves on the Evangelism Commission and Men's Commission for the Archdiocese of Newark. Fr. Bill has a BA in Spanish, and received a Master of Divinity degree in 1982, and an MA in Judeo/Christian studies from Seton Hall University.

Pastor Matheson is married to Joy, has three married children and seven grandchildren. He has been involved in deliverance/spiritual warfare ministry for the past 30 years. He has travelled extensively and taught spiritual warfare in numerous settings in Canada, as well as Columbia, Kenya, Kazakhstan, India, China, Indonesia, Malaysia, Mongolia and the Philippines. Since 1970, teaching at Tyndale University and Seminary, presently Professor Emeritus of New Testament and since 1979, Teaching Pastor at Chartwell Baptist Church in Oakville, Ontario, presently Pastor Emeritus.

Fr. Joseph holds a Doctorate in Theology from the University of St. Michael's College, at the University of Toronto. A scholar at Lonergan Research Institute, Regis College, Toronto, he specializes in Lonergan and Kierkegaard Studies, Theology and Development, African Christian Studies and Spirituality for Healing. Pastorally, he is Chaplain at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Center, Toronto. Father is the author of *Deepening the Christian Faith and Moral Integrity and Igbo (African) Cultural Values*. His next book, *Lonergan, Social Transformation and Sustainable Human Development* will be released next year.
